

KCNA Advisory Group (KAG) - Talking Points

- KCNA has established an Advisory Group of major stakeholders to provide input and feedback on issues that are important to the user community and to the long-term sustainability of KYWired as well as the advancement of broadband access to achieve its many economic and quality of life benefits throughout the Commonwealth.
- KentuckyWired is a government project constructing over 3,000 miles of ultra-high-speed, high-capacity fiber optic cable into every county in the Commonwealth.
- It will connect state offices and institutions, universities, community colleges, and libraries. It will also have points to which private companies can connect.
- KentuckyWired will pay for itself. Kentucky will recoup costs by owning its own fiber optic “middle mile” network rather than leasing it. KentuckyWired will further spur economic development and generate revenue by leasing half of the fiber in the cable to private companies.
- It is funded through the sale of bonds - \$307 million, \$23.5 million in federal grants, and \$30 million from the general fund.
- It will enable private internet service providers and cellular companies to expand their services to areas previously unserved.
- It was enacted in 2015, during the Beshear Administration. The first portion of KentuckyWired should be completed in late 2018 or early 2019.
